LET'S READ:

Exodus 1:1–7



LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Our reading today reminds us who Jacobs' sons were. Remember there were 12 sons. One of them was Joseph, who was already living in Egypt. If you recall from our previous studies there was a famine. Joseph's family was re-united and Pharaoh invited Joseph's family to come and live in the land of Goshen in Egypt, until the famine was over. Our reading tells us that the family consisted of 70 people who came down to Egypt. Over time they increased abundantly in numbers. Many generations have passed and Joseph and his brothers have died and a new generation of this family is now living in Egypt.

Can you think of something that God has blessed you with where those blessings have been multiplied many times over?

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

From our reading today, we know a new King or Pharaoh came to the throne. Even though he knew the wonderful work that Joseph had done for his country, he chose not to acknowledge it. The new King wasn't happy with the large Hebrew population. He was worried that they may make war against the Egyptians, so he made them slaves to build his cities. The King made their lives very hard but they still grew in numbers.

When we continually worry about things, we can make life difficult for the people living around us. God wants to carry our worries for us. Ask God to take your burdens and worries away from you today!

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

The King's plan had failed. The King decided to issue a cruel command. He wanted the Midwives, who helped the Israelite mothers when they were having their babies, to kill all the baby boys. Satan was behind this new rule. He knew God was going to raise a deliverer for His people and Satan did not want this to happen. The Midwives loved God and they decide not to carry out this new rule. God blessed the Israelites and they continued to grow in number.



Think about those brave Midwives, standing up for doing what was right. They loved and feared God. The word 'feared' in this context means they greatly respected God. Because of their faithfulness, God blessed them. Always remember that God will look after you and bless you when you stand strong for Him and do what is right.

Exodus 1:22, 2:1–4



LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Our reading tells us the King was very angry—his plan had failed again. He issued a new command. He wanted all the newborn baby boys to be thrown into the river. How awful! But the Bible tells us the baby girls could live. During this time a baby boy was born to parents named Amram and Jochebed. You can find their names in Exodus 6:20. Moses' parents kept his birth a secret because they didn't want him to be thrown into the river. But you can only hide a baby for a short time and at three months Jochebed had to make a plan. She

made a little boat out of bulrushes and made it waterproof and laid Moses inside and placed the boat in amongst the reeds by the riverbank.



Think about the faith that Moses' parents had. From our memory verse this week, recorded in the great faith chapter of the Bible, it tells us that Moses' parents, at the peril of their own lives, decided to take this great step of faith. I think they knew that God had a very special job for their baby son to do when he grew up. Pray and ask God what special job He wants you to do for Him.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Our reading today tells us that Pharaoh's daughter found Moses. God is so good! God always has a plan. I think perhaps the angels guided the Pharaoh's daughter right to the spot where Moses was. Miriam, who was watching from close by, saw the Princess show tenderness to her brother. Miriam approached her and asked if she would like a woman to nurse and take care of the baby. With permission granted, Miriam actually brought her own mother to the Princess. This meant that Jochebed was able to take care of her own son.

Think about how God brought something good out of something bad. Through the incredible faith and prayers of Moses' parents God preserved Moses in an amazing way. Ask God today to help you have more faith in Him. We cannot ever tire God in asking for more and more faith.

This was preparing him for leadership in the Egyptian court. Our reading

in Acts 7:22 tells us that Moses became a great man.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

From our reading today, we find that things had drastically changed. Moses made the mistake—just like Abraham and Jacob before him—of doing things his way instead of God’s way. Moses took matters into his own hands, instead of leaving them to God. God was going to deliver the Children of Israel from slavery, not Moses. So Moses had to flee and found himself in the land of Midian.

God has many things to teach us and He has an amazing plan for each of our lives. Ask Him today to guide you into the plan He has for you.
