LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Long before God created the earth, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit had a plan to meet the future sin problem—to destroy sin yet save the sinner. This plan was dangerous for God, as Satan would take control of the whole universe if it failed. The plan was that Jesus would willingly become a human so He could die for us (see 1 Peter 1: 18–21).

When God warned Adam and Eve not to eat from the tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, He said, “In the day that you eat of it, you shall surely die” (Genesis 2:17). According to God's word, the penalty for Adam and Eve's sin was that they would die. But that very day God began His amazing rescue plan to save sinners. Only Jesus could do this special job. This week we will learn more about God's glorious plan—the plan of salvation.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Let's look more closely at why God chose to save people, and what that tells us about Him. One reason is because God made us. We are so special to Him, and He loves us. God loves everything He has made, and cares for it. He makes the grass beautiful by decorating it with flowers. He watches over the birds and other animals, and helps them to find food. He sees every time a little bird is hurt. But as people, we are extra special to God, because He made us with His own hands, in His image.

Jesus knew that to save us would be a huge sacrifice. We can hardly even imagine or understand just how great a sacrifice Father, Son and Holy Spirit made when they decided they would save us. But God's love for us is so great that He chose willingly to make that sacrifice. God made us for a special job, or purpose. God will do absolutely all He can to make sure His purpose is *fulfilled* (done) in our lives.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Yesterday we learned that God chose to save us because of His great love for us. But saving people is only part of God's plan. He could also do something even more important. We know that in heaven Lucifer, who became Satan, told many lies about God and God's law. Lucifer's lies were so clever that even those who were loyal to God could not see what would happen if they did what Lucifer said. If God had destroyed Lucifer straight away, the angels that followed him, along with those who were loyal to God, would not understand why He did that. They would always question God's love and would wonder if Lucifer had been right all along.

If we follow His plan to save us, God can reveal what He is really like to the whole universe. For instance, one of Satan's lies is that God is unmerciful. Satan claims that God did not give him a fair chance in heaven. But through the plan of salvation, God shows that He is both merciful and truthful (fair, just). Every person who is saved will be an eternal reminder to every being in the universe of God's amazing mercy. That is the meaning of our key text for today, Ephesians 2:7.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Jesus' great sacrifice to save us shows everyone in the universe two important things: what God is like, and why His law is so important. How does it do that? Have you ever made a model of something, like an animal, or a house? A model is a little version of something much bigger.

Our key text for today tells us that our world is like a model. Like a model, it shows in a small way the results of loving God, and obeying His law; or following Satan, and breaking God's law. All the angels, as well as beings on other worlds God made, are watching to see what happens on Earth. In everything that happens, they can see that following God brings happiness and life. They also see that disobeying God brings sadness, pain, and death. Because of what is happening on Earth today, the loyal beings never, ever want to sin. They know sin is very dangerous. One day soon, sin will come to its end. After that, the whole universe will be safe from sin, forever, all because of Jesus' sacrifice.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Genesis 3:15 is one of the most amazing prophecies of the Bible. One of the things it foretells is the conflict, or war, that has been happening on Earth ever since Adam and Eve sinned. This war will last until God makes our world brand new. This big war is often called the great controversy.

There are 2 sides in this war: good versus evil. There are also 2 leaders. The leader of the good side is Jesus, also called Michael in some prophecies. The “seed of the woman” (Genesis 3:15) is another name for Jesus. The leader of the evil side is Satan, also called the serpent or dragon. Each person who ever lives on Earth must choose one side or the other. Those who choose God's side are called God's children. Those who choose Satan's side are called the children, or seed, of the devil. God's children follow and obey God, while Satan's children follow and obey Satan.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

When Eve, then Adam, ate the fruit from the tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil, each made a sad decision that has changed everything on Earth. Because of that, each person that has ever been born on Earth is attracted to sin. Things in nature that don't understand sin, like plants and animals, have also been changed. Now animals hunt and kill one another. They suffer pain and die. Thorns, thistles, and poisonous plants grow, and plants die. All these are *RESULTS* of sin.

But Jesus also made a choice. Jesus chose to live on earth as a human and to suffer the *RESULTS* of sin, like every person who has ever lived. But Jesus would also do something that no being has ever done before. On the cross, He would experience the penalty of sin for every human. The *PENALTY* of sin is *eternal death*, called the second death in Revelation 2:11; 20:6, etc. Jesus took the penalty for *OUR* sins upon Himself. Those who choose to accept Jesus' sacrifice will not suffer the *penalty* of sin. Those who choose to continue to sin and to reject Jesus' sacrifice will die the second death themselves. Why do that, when Jesus has done it for us?
