KEY TEXT: 2 Peter 3:9

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

From our study so far, we know that God had made a wonderful plan to save people. Jesus and angels, with the help of the Holy Spirit, revealed God's plan to prophets. God made a solemn promise, a *covenant*, with all people through Adam and Eve that He would send Jesus to suffer the full penalty of sin. In those days, a person who was sorry for doing wrong would sacrifice a clean animal, often a lamb, to show faith in God's covenant promise.

Satan, God's enemy, had planned to make Earth his kingdom, from where he would take over the universe. Now, God was disrupting his plan. Satan was furious! He worked as hard as he could to ruin God's plan to save us. Sadly, Cain and his family listened to Satan's lies about God. They became so bad that the whole earth was filled with violence.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

God was so sad at the wickedness on earth. Genesis 6:6 tells us that He was “grieved”. That means Cain’s family had completely rejected God’s Holy Spirit. They didn’t listen to Noah, God’s prophet, who warned them about the coming flood. Because of that, only eight people were saved, when anyone of them could have been saved if they had chosen to believe God.

So God gave the world a new start. But it wasn’t long before people again rejected God and His covenant. This time it was Ham’s family that was especially rebellious. They built a city and the Tower of Babel, which God knew was not good. Next, God confused their speech so they would spread out over the earth as He had told them to.


AGES AFTER THE FLOOD

So much of the Earth was changed by the Flood. A lot of food was destroyed, so God allowed people to eat animals as well as plants. This greatly shortened how long people would live. Work out the ages of these people who lived after the Flood. You can read more about them in Genesis 11:10-32.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

By keeping God's law, Abraham's family would show others what God is like. Because of that, God promised to give Abraham's family the land of Canaan. Three continents—Europe, Asia, and Africa—all meet at the land of Canaan, also called Palestine. As people travelled through Palestine to reach other places, they would pass through the place where Abraham's family was living and learn about God. Abraham's family would teach these people about God, His laws, and the promised Messiah. Then they would spread the news about God all over the world and people everywhere would be happy obeying God's laws. They would also be prepared to welcome Jesus when He came to Earth.

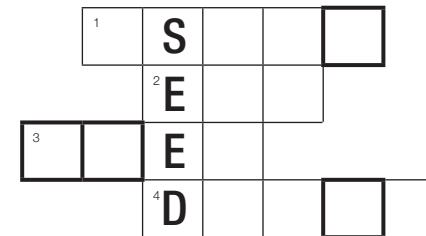
LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Even though people continued to reject God, He still loved everyone and longed to save them. But God couldn't save those who disobeyed Him. Even many of Shem's descendant—his children, grandchildren, and so on—started to worship idols. But God found one man who loved Him—Abram, or Abraham.

God knew that He could trust Abraham to remember His laws, obey them, and teach them to his family. Because of that, God gave Abraham's whole family a very special job to do! He promised to bless Abraham and his family with the best gifts of heaven, so that they could share those gifts with others.

LET'S READ:

Genesis 26:5; Job 1:10.

KEY TEXT: Psalm 119:142

“Your righteousness is an everlasting righteousness, and Your law is truth.”

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Genesis 26:5 tells us that Abraham obeyed God and kept His laws. For Abraham to know them, they must have been handed down from one generation to another. It was only because people kept forgetting God's law that He wrote it down for the Israelites—so it could no longer be forgotten.

In Deuteronomy 30:9–11 it says that God will be with us and take care of our needs IF we obey His commandments. As long as Abraham and his family obeyed God's law, He could protect and care for them. It is the same with us.

WEIGHING HEARTS

The eighth commandment tells us not to steal. It means to not take anything of value from someone else because it is not yours—whether it belongs to God or man. God wants us to be strictly honest in all things. What do these verses say about honesty in measuring quantities?

Leviticus 19:36: “You shall have _ _ _ _ _ scales, honest weights, an honest ephah, and an honest hin.” (ephah and hin were like our grams and kilograms)

Proverbs 11:1: Dishonest scales are an

From these verses, we see that, with God, honesty is very important because God is honest. Honesty comes from a heart that loves other people and always wants the best for them—not for self. Like a ruler, God uses His law to measure our hearts through our actions and words. Though God's law is a high standard, with His help, we can keep it.
