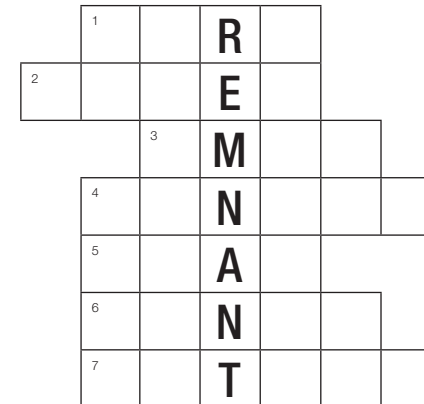
LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

God had chosen to bless Abraham's family so He could come into the world through them. This way He would bless the whole world. When Satan realised God's plans for Abraham's family, he worked very hard to stop God. He knew that he had to deceive them to disobey God, or destroy them.

Satan was almost successful. *Almost*, but not quite. For thousands of years, he did everything to deceive the Israelites. Nearly everyone believed his lies. But there were always a few people, called a *remnant*, who stayed true to God. From this remnant, the Holy Spirit chose people to work for Him, and gave them spiritual gifts to do their special work. Some He called to be prophets. God worked through them to help the Israelites turn back to God.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

God had called Abraham's family to be different to all the other people on Earth. Other nations were worshipping idols, which meant they actually were worshipping Satan and his evil angels. Because of that, they were copying Satan and doing what he wanted them to. God's plan was that Israel would be different, because they would be obeying His laws.

But the Israelites developed the bad habit of looking at what the other nations were doing, and copying them. As they did that, they began to forget about God and what He had done for them in the past. They also began to forget about His plan for them, and promise to send Jesus. God needed people from His faithful remnant to write down the truth about His acts in the past (history) and His plans for the future (prophecy). The writings of many of these faithful people became our Holy Bible—God's written Word.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Yesterday we learned that God is the ultimate Author of the Bible. But, He did so by the hand of around 40 different men over 1500 years or so. 2 Timothy 3:16–17 says that those who wrote the Bible were inspired by God in what they wrote. 1 Thessalonians 2:13 tells us that the Bible is indeed the word of God—not the word of men. 1 Corinthians 10:11 says that the Bible contains special messages from God for the people right at the end of time—that includes us! Jesus sent the Holy Spirit with messages to His prophets so that we, living today, would know the truth that we need to know in order to be saved. Although the prophets mostly wrote the messages in their own words, the Holy Spirit impressed truth into their minds so that they would know what to record for us.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

God's prophets were often given *revelations* of truths they couldn't work out themselves. The Bible uses a different word to describe how the prophets shared those messages and recorded them for us in the Bible. That word is *INSPIRATION*. 1 Corinthians 2:13 promises us that, because of the Holy Spirit, the messages that have been recorded for us in the Bible are not just people's thoughts. They are actually *God's* thoughts, expressed in *people's* words, and that the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Truth, will help us understand ALL the truth of God.

Much of the Bible is history, while some parts are records that prophets have made of the visions and other messages they received from God. This is not the only source of Bible information. Some parts are what other trustworthy people said. For example, King Solomon used wise sayings written by other people. But because the Holy Spirit inspired *all* of the Bible writers, we know that the **WHOLE** Bible is true and that God wants us to know and understand it.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

When we read the Bible, it is just like hearing God's voice speaking directly to us. We know that the Holy Spirit is the member of the Godhead that especially inspired the Bible writers. And today, Jesus has promised that the Holy Spirit will help US understand the words of the Bible writers! That's why it's important to always pray before reading the Bible. Otherwise, Satan and his evil angels will twist the words of the Bible in our minds, so we won't understand it, believe it, or obey God.

2 Peter 1:20 tells us that we should not interpret the Bible to suit ourselves, but we must let the Holy Spirit lead us. If one part is difficult to understand, another part will explain it. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you and obey His leading.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

While the Israelites were in Egypt, they began to worship idols and forget God. When they cried out to Him for help, God worked many mighty miracles to save them. He fulfilled all His promises to them by bringing them into the land of Canaan.

But sadly, the Israelites didn't keep their promises to God. They first tried to hide the evil things they were doing. But God knew that the Israelites would destroy themselves if they continued to sin. In His great love for them He sent His prophets to warn them. Finally, they had been wicked for so long that, in the days of Jeremiah, they even accused the prophet of lying when he gave them God's messages! So, they had to go into captivity in Babylon for 70 years. Even after that they didn't really change—they didn't accept Jesus. But God is merciful, and gave them another 490 years to decide if they would obey Him or not.
