LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

This week's lesson is about the greatest miracle and mystery of all—how Jesus became a human baby. The birth of every baby is a miracle, because only God can give life. But even more amazing is the birth of Jesus. Unlike every other human baby, Jesus' life did not start when His mother Mary became pregnant. Jesus was not only a human baby—the Bible tells us clearly that Jesus is God. That means He is eternal. There was never a time when He did not exist. In Jesus, God became part of His own creation!

Because Jesus is God, we know other things about Him. For one, He is self-existent. From the beginning, He had all power and wisdom. He could be everywhere at once. He created all things. Above all, Jesus is love. It was Jesus' love that led Him to make the choice to become a human being so that He could save you, me, and everyone who believes in Him.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

After Adam and Eve sinned, God the Father *communicated* with people through Jesus. It was Jesus, as God, who came to tell Adam and Eve about God's plan to save them. He was the One who promised Abraham that he and Sarah would have a baby, talked with Moses at the burning bush (see Exodus 3:2, 6, 14 & John 8:56–58), led His people in a cloud, spoke God's law from Sinai, and gave the promised land to the Israelites. All that Jesus did showed the great love of God for His people.

Have you ever seen a mother animal caring for her babies? Deuteronomy 32:11,12 says that is how God cared for Israel, His people. How sad Jesus was when they turned away from Him! Jesus sent the Holy Spirit who send prophets to warn the people about the consequences of their sins. But they still wouldn't listen. Because they were worshipping idols, they came to have many false ideas about God. Finally, Jesus had to come Himself to show us just what God is really like. Jesus would show God's love to, not only people, but to all the angels and beings from unfallen worlds.

THERE'S **POWER** IN THE WORD!

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Although there are three Persons in the Godhead, the Bible says that God is “one”. That is because God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit work together as one on everything. They are one in *character* and *purpose*, but not one body. God said it should be the same with a husband and wife. So although the Bible does not tell us a lot about the Holy Spirit, we know that He is working just as hard as the Father and Son to save us. He works in our hearts and minds.

We have already looked at many important jobs of the Holy Spirit in the plan of salvation. For example, He chose the prophets and inspired them to write God's messages in the Old Testament; He gives us spiritual gifts; He reveals mysteries about God's plan. Our key text today says the Holy Spirit did something extra special so that Jesus could be born. It was through the Holy Spirit that Jesus was created as a baby inside Mary, His human mother. So, although Jesus was born of a normal woman, He was not just human. He was also the Son of God.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Since Jesus didn't look like a shining, majestic being when He came to earth, how would anyone know He was God or the promised Messiah? The Old Testament prophets didn't get to see Him on earth. But, the Holy Spirit revealed many amazing prophecies to them about the coming Messiah, His work, death and resurrection.

There are many *direct prophecies* about the first coming of the Messiah in the Old Testament. Also, many of the Temple ceremonies and sacrifices pointed directly to the work of the Messiah through symbols. These are *indirect prophecies*. The New Testament gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, show how every one of these prophecies was fulfilled exactly by Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus wanted people to know He was God, not as a shiny, majestic being, but because He fulfilled all the Old Testament prophecies of the coming Messiah.
