THERE'S **POWER** IN THE WORD!

LET'S READ:

Matthew 4:1,2; Mark 1:12,13; Luke 4:1,2.

KEY TEXT: Matthew 4:2

"And when He had fasted forty days and forty nights, afterward He was hungry."

After He was baptised, Jesus went to the wilderness to be alone with God, His Father. From Bible prophecy, Jesus knew He would be opposed by Satan and all his evil angels at every moment of His life on Earth. The Son of God knew He would need special strength from His Father to be able to save us from sin.

For forty days, Jesus was so focused on talking to His Father that He ate nothing. But when those days were over, Jesus felt weak and hungry. He knew if He didn't eat something soon, He would die. Because He could become hungry, Matthew 4:2 shows that Jesus became completely human, although He was God. He suffered, the way we sometimes suffer. That tells us He understands exactly how we feel.

THERE'S **POWER** IN THE WORD!

LET'S READ:

Matthew 4:3; 2 Corinthians 11:14.

KEY TEXT: Isaiah 8:20

"To the law and to the testimony! If they do not speak according to this word, it is because there is no light in them."

Matthew 4:3 tells us that the devil came to Jesus and tempted Him. Many people think that the devil has horns, a tail, and a pitchfork. But 2 Corinthians 11:14 warns us that Satan often appears as an angel of light from heaven. In the Garden of Eden, Satan appeared to Eve looking like a serpent. When first created, serpents didn't slither on the ground (Genesis 3:14). The Bible warns us that Satan disguises his temptations and makes sin seem attractive and fun—like he did to Eve.

When choosing what to do we cannot make a decision based on our feelings—what we see, touch, taste, hear, or desire. Isaiah 8:20 tells us that God, and those who love Him, will always encourage us to obey God's law. When we choose God's way, no matter what others may say, do, or think, we can know Jesus is with us.

KEY TEXT: Matthew 24:24


"For false christs and false prophets will rise and show great **signs** and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect."

When Satan appeared to Jesus, he said, "If you are the Son of God." Satan knew Jesus was the Son of God. But he was trying to tempt Jesus to use His power to work a miracle for Himself, instead of for others, to prove that He really was God's Son. This would have been against His Father's will—and that would be sin.

The Bible tells us that evil angels can work miracles (or signs) too. In the Garden of Eden, Eve saw a serpent talking! With the help of their god (Satan), Pharoah's magicians turned their rods into serpents. These things tell us that *not all miracles* are God's work. The Bible warns us that at the very end of time, many people will be deceived by miracles worked by evil spirits. We should test everything we see and hear by God's word, as Jesus did, because the Bible is God's truth.

LET'S READ:

Genesis 2:16,17; Daniel 1:8; 1 Corinthians 10:31.

KEY TEXT: Matthew 4:3.

"Now when the tempter came to Him, he said, "If You are the Son of God, command that these stones become bread."

In the Garden of Eden, the test of Adam and Eve's loyalty to God was whether or not to eat a piece of fruit. When Daniel and his three friends were taken to Babylon, their first test was whether or not to eat King Nebuchadnezzar's unhealthy food, which had also been offered to idols. Jesus' first temptation in the wilderness was to turn stones into bread. These tests show that it is very important to make the right choices in eating, as food and drink is the easiest place for Satan to tempt us.

Today, a lot of experiments have been done by scientists, which show that the food we eat has a huge impact on our health—both in mind and body. The experiments give us extra evidence to show that the food God created for us to enjoy is the best for staying healthy and thinking clearly. God has given us delicious food that is healthy for our bodies and minds, and enjoyable to eat.

LET'S READ:

Matthew 4:3-11; Ephesians 6:17

KEY TEXT: Ephesians 6:12.

"For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places."

When Satan tempted Jesus in the wilderness, it was a battle in the great controversy, the massive war between good and evil that Satan had started in heaven. In the wilderness, neither Jesus nor Satan used swords, guns or other weapons that you can see and touch. The weapons they used were words. Satan *lied*, Jesus told the *truth*.

Have you ever had an argument with someone? Or has someone ever said something very mean to you? Have you ever felt like crying because of someone else's words? If so, that is a war of words. Satan's words of temptation were very painful to Jesus. But Jesus spoke the truth back to Satan. Jesus used God's sharp sword, the words of the Bible, and won a huge victory.

KEY TEXT: Luke 4:4

"But Jesus answered him, saying, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.'"

Every time Jesus was tempted, He answered using the Bible, saying, "It is written." We may be tempted to do, eat/drink, or say things that we shouldn't. But we *must choose* to obey God every time. Satan will try to make us think we will miss out if we obey God. But that is not true. Even though it may be hard to say no, we can still be happy inside, knowing that Jesus understands because He was tempted too. It is so important to remember Bible verses. Then we can be ready with God's sword when Satan tempts us.
