LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

After defeating Satan in the wilderness, Jesus returned to the Jordan River. John had been preaching there for many months by now. His work caused a lot of excitement and crowds of people followed him. Almost everyone was sure he was a prophet, and some hoped he might be the Messiah himself!

How did the leaders of Israel respond to John? Sadly, they didn't believe John, or listen to his words. But there were some people who had been listening carefully to him. One day, John caught sight of Jesus and, pointing to Him said, “Behold the Lamb of God!” Two of John's disciples, Andrew and another man, decided to follow Jesus. They were His very first disciples.

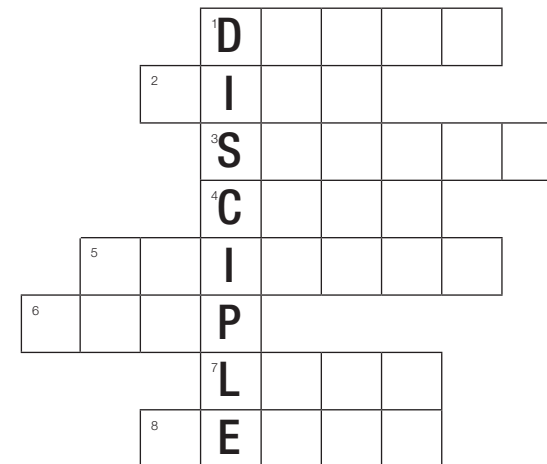
LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

Yesterday we learned the names of Jesus' first disciples. What is a disciple? A disciple is someone who follows, or learns from, another person. A disciple spends a lot of time with his or her teacher, or master, and tries to imitate, or copy, everything the teacher does. A disciple wants to be just like his or her teacher.

Let's think a bit more about who can be a disciple of Jesus. Jesus' first disciples were mostly fishermen. That tells us that they did not have lots of money. They were not famous people, nor did they have a high position in society, like a king or prime minister. That tells us that we don't need to have money, a high position or fame to be a disciple of Jesus. The most important thing about being a disciple of Jesus is to willingly and cheerfully do whatever He asks us to do.

LET'S THINK ABOUT THIS

The law is a copy of God's character. In a previous study, we saw that God is holy, and His law is holy. God is eternal, righteous, just, and good, and so is His law. Most of all, God is love. God's law is also love. The law is made up of 2 parts: love to God (commandments 1-4) and love to others (commandments 5-10). Romans 13:10 says, “Love is the fulfilment of the law.”

With the help of the Holy Spirit, our characters can be changed so that we can keep God's wonderful law of love. When Adam and Eve were first created, they naturally obeyed God's law. Because of their sin, we as their children do not naturally love God's law. But if we ask for God's help, He can change our hearts, so that we love and obey God's law. Then, we will truly to be showing love to every person we meet.

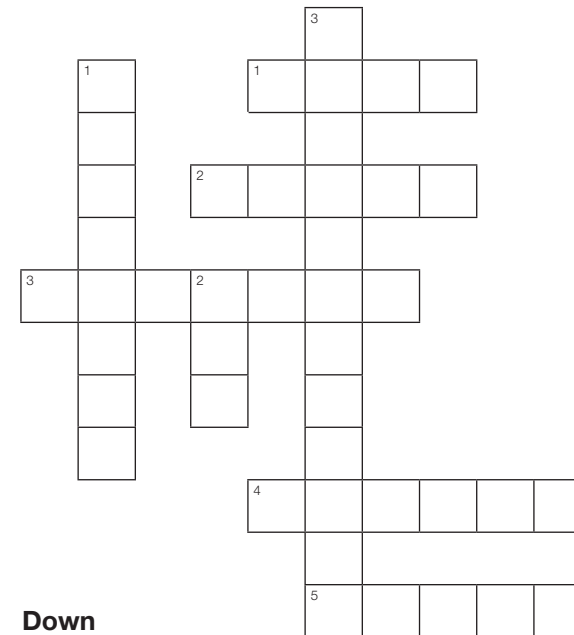
